
## Principal's workshop on "Implementation and Challenges of NEP-2020"

## TRAINING & PLACEMENT ACTIVITIES



### Jai Bala Ji (SHG ) Rural mart

#### Summary of " Jai Bala Ji (SHG ) Rural mart NABARD Shoppe " Establishment of Physical Rural Mart – Bahal

A Physical Rural Mart has been initiated recently near Shyam Bhawan, Old Bazaar, Bahal, District Bhiwani, Haryana – 127028, covering the geographical area of Village & Post Office Bahal. The mart is aimed at promoting rural entrepreneurship and providing a marketplace for locally made products. Items available at the mart include food products such as pickles, papad, murabba, biscuits, cakes, spices, and dairy products, along with handmade items like bangles, traditional costumes, jewellery, fancy bags, incense sticks, washing powder, and handicrafts. This initiative is expected to strengthen local livelihoods and empower rural artisans, especially women-led self-help groups (SHGs).



### Fashion Design/Tailoring Training Programme Sanctioned By NABARD

A fashion design training program was arranged at Hisar Jail II for a batch of 30 female jail inmates, under the banner of BRHD Charitable Trust and Gifting Smile Foundation New Delhi and has been completed successfully. The inmates showcased the skills learnt at the training program by designing a number of blouses, tops, skirts, trousers, cushion covers, etc. Some of the products were sold at Surajkund Mela, Faridabad, and the income generated through this was distributed among the participants accordingly. The lab setup for this project is being continuously used by the trained women inmates to produce bedsheets, bags, pillow covers, and cushion covers based on the orders received by the jail authorities. This initiative has not only empowered the inmates with valuable vocational skills but also boosted their confidence and self-reliance. The training emphasized both creativity and quality, enabling the women to meet market standards. Regular mentorship and quality checks ensured that the products were saleable and appreciated by buyers. The program has also opened up avenues for potential rehabilitation and reintegration into society post-release. Encouraged by its success, the authorities are planning to expand the program to include more participants and product categories.



### Skill Development Program on Wooden Furniture Carpentry – Central Jail, Hisar

The Skill Development Program on Carpenter Wooden Furniture commenced on 01<sup>st</sup> June 2025 at Central Jail, Hisar, and is currently progressing effectively. This 90-day program is designed to equip participants with practical skills and theoretical knowledge in the field of wooden furniture carpentry.

The training is delivered in two separate batches, each consisting of 30 participants. The curriculum includes both classroom instruction and hands-on workshops, covering essential carpentry techniques such as measuring, cutting, joining, and finishing wood. Special focus is given to tool proficiency, safety practices, and sustainable woodworking methods.

The initiative aims to empower individuals by enhancing their employability, encouraging self-reliance, and preserving traditional craftsmanship. Through mentorship by experienced carpenters and a structured learning environment, the program fosters creativity, problem-solving skills, and technical excellence among participants.
