

ABOUT BRCM LAW COLLEGE

BRCM Law College was established at Bahal, District Bhiwani in 2018 by Ballaram Hanumandas Charitable Trust (BHCT) founded in 1977 and headed by Shri Hari Krishna Chaudhary. The College is nestled in more than 100 acres of lush green environment. MOOT PROPOSITION

In the town of Shivnagar, District Ambedkarpur, two sisters - Sneha Kapoor (elder, aged 32) and Ritika Kapoor (younger, aged 29) - were married into the same family.

On 11 Feb 2014, Sneha was married to Arjun Malhotra, the elder son of businessman Mohan Malhotra, while Ritika was married to Rohan Malhotra, the younger son.

Both couples lived in a large ancestral house belonging to the Malhotra family, known in the locality for its prosperity, social standing, and extensive land holdings. The Malhotras ran a family business dealing in automobile parts and agricultural machinery. The house was spacious, with a common courtyard and separate living sections for both brothers and their families.

Both Sneha and Ritika were highly educated and fashion-conscious women. Together, they ran a “Resin art studio” inside the premises named “Ritika Resin Studio”, which catered to local clients and earned them independent income. The sisters were often seen driving luxury cars belonging to the family and wearing expensive attire. Their children studied at an elite private school in the nearby city of Baraut, about 12 km away.

Despite the seemingly happy exterior, tensions simmered inside the house - particularly between Ritika and her husband, Rohan. Rohan often complained that Ritika spent too much time on social media and was neglecting household duties. Both sisters kept their mobile phones secured with passwords and refused to allow anyone access to or inspection of their devices. The sisters frequently posted short videos on Instagram, showcasing beauty tips, festive looks, prank videos and glimpses of their lifestyle. Their popularity was growing; several reels of theirs had crossed thousands of views.

However, the older members of the family — especially Mohan Malhotra (father-in-law) and his wife Kamla Devi — disapproved of such activities. They felt that publicizing family life online was inappropriate and brought “bad name” to the family's reputation. Despite repeated objections, both sisters continued uploading videos, sometimes even from within the house premises, ignoring the family's warnings.

The Incident

On the morning of 17th February 2024, around 10:15 a.m., Rohan Malhotra was seen in the courtyard cleaning the garden area and watering the plants. Several neighbourhood



children, including his own son and Sneha's two children, were playing in the Garden area \. All these activities were captured in the CCTV footage installed on the front of the garden side door and also in the camera installed at the neighbour's house, which is located right next to the garden. Sneha was on the ground floor, scrolling through her phone, reportedly editing a video for her social media page.

Suddenly, loud screams and sounds of commotion emerged from the room on the upper floor of the house where Ritika usually worked. Neighbours and family members rushed in. Thick smoke billowed out from the room and the stairs. Ritika was found engulfed in flames. She was seen by everyone descending the stairs. Her dupatta and nightdress had caught fire.

According to witnesses, and a video recording that was recorded by Sneha while Ritika was seen running downstairs from the upper floor, crying and recording a short video on her phone and shouting, "Bahan, tune ye kya kar liya!" (Sister, what have you done!). Neighbours managed to extinguish the flames using blankets and buckets of water. Ritika was immediately taken to the Civil Hospital, Shivnagar, by Sneha, Rohan, and a few neighbours.

However, Ritika succumbed to her injuries within two hours of admission.

Initial Investigation

The post-mortem report stated that Ritika had suffered 95% thermal burns and that the fire was caused by the use of thinner or a similar inflammable chemical, usually employed for removing nail polish or cleaning paint. The medical officer opined that the burns were ante-mortem, and the cause of death was shock and suffocation due to extensive burns.

No suicide note was recovered. However, traces of thinner were found on the dressing table and floor, suggesting that the substance had been poured before ignition.

The police seized Sneha's mobile phone, in which they discovered the short clip she had recorded while rushing down the stairs. The video, though brief and partially blurred, showed smoke and the burning room. Sneha's voice could be heard crying for help and repeatedly asking, "Bahan, what and why did you do this?"

The investigating officer, Inspector Ravi Dutt, recorded statements from various family



members and neighbours. While the male members of the Malhotra family claimed that Ritika had been emotionally unstable and had taken the extreme step due to her own actions, the Kapoor family (Ritika's parents and Sneha's side) alleged that both sisters were being harassed for dowry and subjected to continuous taunting by their in-laws

Allegations by the Complainant

On 19th February 2024, Ritika's father, Mr. Suresh Kapoor, lodged a written complaint at the Shivrinar Police Station, alleging that his daughters were constantly humiliated and mentally tortured by their in-laws for bringing insufficient dowry. He claimed that during both weddings, held 10 years ago, substantial dowry — including 20 lakh in cash, a car, and gold ornaments — had been given, yet the Malhotra continued to demand additional funds for business expansion.

He further stated that Rohan frequently quarrelled with Ritika and was involved in an extramarital affair, which had led to frequent quarrels at home. They further claimed that Rohan, motivated by his illicit relationship and dowry demands, sometimes, after consuming alcohol, had called her mother several times, complaining of harassment. In support of this, Suresh Kapoor produced WhatsApp voice notes and messages in which Ritika allegedly mentioned being “tired of taunts” and feeling “suffocated in this house.”

The complainant also alleged that, a few days before her death, Ritika had been scolded by her in-laws for uploading an Instagram reel wearing western clothes, which they termed “indecent.”

Subsequent Events

Following Ritika's death, when the men of the family were engaged in post-death rituals and police formalities, Sneha reportedly packed her belongings, gold jewellery, and cash from the house and left for her parental home along with both her children and Ritika's surviving son. She claimed she felt unsafe in the Malhotra residence and feared for her life.

When police questioned her, she reiterated that both she and her sister were victims of continuous harassment for dowry and of restrictions on their independence. She alleged that the family had tried to portray the death as a suicide to escape legal consequences.



However, the police also recorded the statement of Ritika's eight-year-old son, Manan, who stated that he had seen his father holding a lighter and that "Papa set fire to Mama." Later, during cross-examination, Manan hesitated and gave inconsistent answers.

During subsequent media interactions, Sneha was questioned about why she recorded a video of her sister burning instead of attempting to save her. In response, she gave inconsistent explanations. In one instance, she claimed that she was unwell and had a cannula inserted in her hand, and that the video was recorded accidentally while she was trying to remove the cannula. In another statement, she asserted that she had intentionally recorded the video as evidence.

The case is now listed before the Sessions Court for the determination of the following issues:

ISSUES:

- ❖ *Whether the alleged continuous dowry demands and harassment inflicted upon Ritika amount to "cruelty" under Section 80 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita?*
- ❖ *Whether the surrounding circumstances, including the use of inflammable substances, indicate abetment to suicide or constitute dowry death under the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and the Dowry Prohibition Act?*
- ❖ *Whether the contradictory and inconsistent testimony of the child witness, Manan, diminishes the reliability of the prosecution's case?*
- ❖ *Whether Sneha's act of recording a video during the incident, instead of attempting immediate rescue, impacts the determination of abetment or foul play in relation to Ritika's death?*
- ❖ *Whether Sneha's removal of jewellery, cash, and belongings after Ritika's death amounts to tampering with evidence or an attempt to evade legal consequences under the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita?*




